Explanation of Exemptions from page 2

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;

Another \$65,000.00 from the NTSI account was unaccounted for but was apparently withdrawn from the NTSI DIP account. **b6** b7C Trustee On December 9, 1994, LONGO filed bankruptcy for his second company, SCI. A Chapter 7 Bankruptcy was filed and the of Shapiro and Olander. He believes that another partner of the firm may also be working on the case. Timothy McCormick advised he currently is in possession of various company records, including bank account records and depositions filed in bankruptcy proceedings. He believes that the Statute of Limitations may soon be approaching in regard to this matter.





The owner and president of the National Training Systems Inc., which operates trade schools in Glen Burnie and Laurel and in Richmond, Va., has been indicted in Virginia on 46 counts of grand theft stemming from the NTS truck-driving school in Richmond.





NTS in Glen Burnte said to ignore, rules

Jackie Moyner and Leigh Amp Hohman, best friends from Gen Burnie, didn't bat an eyelash when movers carted away the soda machines at their new school Monday.

But when the school didn't give them books by Tuesday, they began to suspect the worst.

Less than 24 hours after enrolling in a 84,195 computer course at the National Training Systems Inc. campus in Glen Burnie, the women say they learned from the president that the school's campus is closing. When they asked for their money back, the president instead urged them to sign up for his correspondence school.

Ms. Moyner, 22, and Ms. Hohman, 20, say they are out at least 8500 — the 10 percent the school gets to keep from their federal stadent loan because they showed up for two days. The school shouldn't haven't enrolled them if it was about to close, the women say, and they are angry.

NTS trade school shuts down, files for bankruptcy

U.S. had acted to restrict funds over irregularities

The state's largest for profit trade school has gone belly up, leaving at least 2,000 students stranded and the U.S. Department of Education facing a potential bill of 87.8 mil-

National Training Systems Inc. filed for protection from creditors under federal bankruptcy laws last week after closing its truck driving and office-computer technology training schools in Baltimore. Glen Burnle and

NTS had been the subject of complaints by students and the target of state charges that it offered unapproved courses and violated other rules.

The school has enrolled tens of thousands of students in its combination study-by-mail and residential courses in truck driving and diesel mechanics during the last two decades, and branched out into computer and office technology in the 1980s. Last year it was the single largest borrower of federally guaranteed loans after the University of Maryland at Baltimore, but many students dropped out and defaulted on their federal loans.

NTS had a default rate of 51.2 percent in 1987 and 28.7 percent in 1988.

In June, the U.S. Department of Education notified NTS that it would withhold tuition money from the school until after students graduated and the school documented that it had followed the rules. Usually, schools get tuition money up front for training students.

NTS President Charles R. Longo did not return a phone message yesterday. Alan Grochal, the attorney handling the NTS bankruptcy, said the school's cash-flow was severely restricted by the federal government's decision three months ago to withhold money from the school.

The company listed 88.6 million in liabilities and 8885,000 in assets, in bankruptcy papers filed Sept. 21. Like many profit-making trade schools, NTS depended heavily on federal money for its income.

By law, the school must refund the full tuition to students who were enrolled when it closed or help them complete their education in another school.

Maryland Higher Education Secretary Shaila R. Aery said yesterday that her office would help place students in other schools and refund tuition from a new fund set up for that purpose with contributions from trade school owners this year. Tuition ranged from 83,000 to 95,000.

State officials said that as many as 2,000 students were enrolled in NTS, many of them in home study programs.



The owner and president of the National Training Systems Inc., which operates trade schools in Glen Burnie and Laurel and in Richmond, Va., has been indicted in Virginia on 46 counts of grand theft stemming from the NTS truck-driving school in Richmond.

Charles R. Longo, 46, was arrested Tuesday and was ordered held without bond yesterday by Prince George's County District Court Judge Sherrie Krauser. He was in the Prince George's County Detention Center,

NTS operates 2 locations in M

awaiting extradition to Richmond, said David Eberhart, a Virginia prosecutor.

The charges of grand theft carry penalties of up to 920 years in prison.

Leonard L. Lucchi, Longo's attorney, yesterday refused to comment on the indictment. He said Longo, who owns a house in Annapolis and rents an apartment in Laurel, told him he was confused about the charges.

Longo and NTS have also been under

scrutiny by the Maryland Higher Education Commission, which in August ordered Longo to remove himself as manager of the Glen Burnie and Laurel schools and to refund tuition payments to students who dropped out of NTS before graduating.

The state charged that Longo has falsified student records to avoid paying the refunds, a practice Longo denied.

The Virginia indictment stems from charges that Longo - through an NTS "sat-

ellite" campus in Richmond — has embezzled about \$138,000 in student tuition fees, destroyed student records and funneled state and federal loan money to start a new shipping, business in Laurel called Shippers Choice, Eberhart said.

An NTS maintenance employee yesterday answered the NTS' Laurel telephone as:

"NTS/Shippers Choice."

NTS of Virginia also added a computer curriculum which was not approved for loan funds from the state and enrolled computer students as truck driving students so they

would qualify for financial aid, Eberhart said.

Virginia officials seized nine trucks belonging to Shippers Choice last week, the prosecutor added.

"We have had zillions of complaints from NTS students. Ad nauseam. Ad infinitum," Eberhart said. "Longo knew he could not train these students and then cashed the valid checks. We believe a majority of the loan funds have ended up in Shippers Choice. He's now out of the education business and into the shipping business."

The Maryland NTS each year enrolls about 4,000 students who pay for courses with state loans and grants.

The Maryland Higher Education Commission charged last summer that NTS did not refund at least 200 state students who attended trade courses not approved by the state or did not complete courses and were due refunds. Higher Education Secretary Shaila Aery ordered NTS to post a bond as insurance that students would be able to complete their education at another trade school if NTS went out of business.

An administrative hearing was held on that order in September; no decision has been reached, a commission spokesman said.

Trade school owner indicted on 46 counts

The owner and president of Maryland's largest for-profit trade school, now bankrupt, has been indicted on 46 counts of grand theft in the operation of National Training Systems' truck-driving school in Richmond, Va.

Charles R. Longo, 46, was arrested Tuesday and ordered held without bond in the Prince George's County Detention Center while awaiting extradition to Richmond, according to a report yesterday in The Evening Sun.

The indictment charges that Mr. Longo embezzled \$138,000 in student tuition fees, destroyed records and funneled government loan money to a new shipping company in Laurel called Shippers Choice, the newspaper said.

The target of numerous complaints from Maryland students, National Training Systems closed its truck driving and office-computer technology training schools in Baltimore, Glen Burnie and Laurel last month and filed for protection from creditors under federal bankruptcy

laws.

This investigation was predicated upon information provided by Criminal Investigator, Department of Education, Washington, D. C., that Charles R. Longo, President of National Training Systems (NTS), was misusing the Federal Pell Grant account. Additional allegations surfaced concerning whether or not NTS paid FICA, Federal and State taxes.

A Department of Education program review determined that over \$222,000.00 in Pell Grants was currently unaccounted for.

Interview of former students disclosed that checks received by them for Pell Grants and for loans were endorsed and given back to the school per Longo's instructions. These students then received small amounts of funds, however, were responsible for paying back all of the loans.

On November 30, 1990, Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) District of Maryland, Baltimore, Maryland, was contacted and advised that he would decline prosecution against Charles Longo and NTS as Longo was indicted in the State of Virginia and is being prosecuted for embezzlement of State and Federal tuition fees. In addition, Prince Georges County, Maryland and the Maryland Attorney General's Office are also conducting investigations into the activities of NTS and Charles R. Longo.

In view of the above facts, the Baltimore Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation is conducting no further investigation in this matter.





WILLIAM F. HOWARD'S MOTION TO QUASH TRIAL SUBPOENA SERVED BY DEFENDANT STONE

William F. Howard, Deputy of the Educational Affairs Division of the Office of the Attorney General of Maryland, a non-party, by his attorneys, J. Joseph Curran, Jr., Attorney General of Maryland, and Andrew M. McDonald, Assistant Attorney General, respectfully submits this Motion to Quash pursuant to Maryland Rule 2-510(e) and Gilbert & Mark Sapperstein's good buddy

- 1. Mr. Howard moves this Court to quash the subpoena served upon him by Defendant Donald D. Stone (pro se) in order to protect Mr. Howard from undue burden and expense, annoyance, oppression, and a waste of time and State resources. Mr. Howard has no personal knowledge of facts or possession of any documents relevant to the trial of this case.
- 2. On June 1, 1995, Mr. Howard was served in the Office of the Attorney General with a subpoena requested by Mr. Stone, acting pro se. This subpoena ordered Mr. Howard to personally appear to testify in the trial of this case on June 19, 1995. The subpoena further ordered Mr. Howard to produce at that time "All documents

pertaining to Charles R. Longo, Shippers Choice, National Training Systems, and Bruff J. Procter." A copy of the subpoena is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

- 2. Mr. Stone has also reportedly requested that similar subpoenas be served upon Hon. Janet Reno, Attorney General of the United States; Hon. Lynne Battaglia, United States Attorney for Maryland; Hon. Louis J. Freeh, Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and Hon. J. Joseph Curran, Jr., Attorney General of Maryland; among others.
- 3. This case appears to involve a dispute between Plaintiffs
 Donald Stone Industries, Inc. and Charles R. Longo and Defendant
 Donald J. Stone arising out of an unhappy business venture.
 Plaintiffs seek declaratory judgments and injunctions effectively
 giving them control over certain inventions and patents.
 Plaintiffs also seek substantial compensatory damages.
- 4. Mr. Howard has no personal knowledge of any facts relevant to the trial of this case, as set forth in his Affidavit, attached hereto as Exhibit 2. Similarly, Mr. Howard does not have possession of any documents relevant to the trial of this case. In addition, the documents identified in the subpoena, which are wholly irrelevant to the facts of this case, are quite voluminous. These documents are presently stored in approximately 20 boxes.

When and if Attorney General Curran is served with a subpoena in this case, this Office will file a Motion to Quash, on the grounds that Attorney General Curran, like Mr. Howard, has no personal knowledge of facts relevant to the trial of this case.

Howard lying, cheating, stealing and falsifying affidavits in a court of law, obstructing justice on behalf of MD. AG. Curran and his buddies Gilbert & Mark Sapperstein.

- 5. To require Mr. Howard to appear to testify in this case or to produce the documents identified would subject Mr. Howard to undue burden and expense, would be oppressive, and would waste valuable State resources.
- 6. It is difficult to understand Mr. Stone's motivation for subpoenaing Mr. Howard. Mr. Stone could be engaging in a misguided fishing expedition, or he could be attempting to harass Mr. Howard and the other officials he has subpoenaed. Whatever Mr. Stone's motivation, however, the subpoena served upon Mr. Howard should be quashed.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, William F. Howard, a non-party, requests this Court to quash the trial subpoena served upon him in this case by Defendant Donald J. Stone.
